(a) FAIRPLAY TRAINING & MANUAL for Coaches, Educators, Clubs

Throughout the reporting period from July 2023 to July 2024, we implemented a diverse range of impactful activities. Please find the breakdown below.

1. Football 3 Training Program

Date: 26. - 30.11.2023

Location: Cologne/GER

Participants: IZI and Fairplay Staff

Description:

From November 26 to 30, 2023, IZI and fairplay staff, participated in an intensive Football 3 education program in Cologne, Germany. Hosted by the RheinFlanke organization, the training aimed to enhance our capacity to implement the Football 3 methodology, a unique approach to sports education that emphasizes conflict resolution, inclusion, and positive behavior among young people.

The training consisted of 18 hours of in-person sessions designed to certify participants as Football 3 mediators, enabling them to independently facilitate Football 3 matches and serve as mediators in official tournaments. During the training, our representatives were introduced to innovative play and learning methods, gaining valuable insights into how sports can be leveraged to address challenges such as conflicts and violence in youth communities.

The RheinFlanke Academy, renowned for its expertise in using sport and exercise-based methods for educational purposes, provided a conducive learning environment, fostering the growth of both our educators and the young people they work with. The experience was enriched by the exchange of knowledge with international peers, and the practical application of Football 3 techniques in real-world scenarios. Upon completion of the training, both IZI and fairplay staff were awarded certificates, officially recognizing them as qualified Football 3 mediators. This certification not only adds to the professional development of our team but also strengthens our organization's ability to promote fair play and inclusivity in sports.





b) FAIRPLAY WORKSHOPS for Kids (10-16 years)

The fairplay workshops are workshops with a structured methodology that combines interactive sports with reflective dialogue designed to teach values of fairness, teamwork, respect, non-discrimination and many other significant social topics. Each workshop promotes both physical activity and social education, engaging young participants with relevant social issues such as discrimination, social exclusion, and inequality. This flexible approach allows facilitators to adjust the workshops to fit various community contexts, making it possible to address the specific challenges and needs of different groups. Participants are guided through activities that build resilience, empathy, and a strong sense of community, fostering a supportive space for personal and social growth.

The fairplay workshops can be tailored to engage with diverse social issues and marginalized communities, including migrants, minorities, and gender-specific groups. This adaptability enables the program to address a wide range of topics, from fostering integration among migrant populations to promoting gender equality and interethnic cooperation. Youth leave the workshops equipped with practical tools to apply fairplay principles beyond sports.

1. Workshop and Tour Station during UEFA Grassroots week 2023

Date: 29.09.2023

Location: Bugojno, Bosnia and Herzegovina

Workshop facilitators: Kristijan Veselinović, Omar Džulović, Selma Memović

Total number of participants: Approximately 100 (70 male, 30 female)

Description:

Held during UEFA Grassroots Week in collaboration with Taekwondo Club Shenron, this workshop and Tour Station gathered around 70 children for a dynamic day of activities centered around fairplay and inclusion. Organized in a Mini Van Tour format, the event featured various stations, including streetkick, football tennis, taekwondo demonstrations, and a fitness station, allowing participants to rotate through a variety of sports and learning experiences.

Each station promoted cooperation and fair competition, with facilitators introducing key principles of respect, anti-discrimination, and sportsmanship. Children were encouraged to participate in discussions about what fairplay means and how it can be applied both on and off the field. The event created a happy atmosphere, celebrating diversity through teamwork and active engagement. The workshop received positive feedback from attendees and their families, establishing a strong foundation for future fairplay activities in the community.



2. Workshop with Migrants and Refugees at Safet Zajko Training Center

Date: 26.04.2024

Location: Safet Zajko Sports Center

Partners: International Organization for Migration (IOM) and FC Respekt

Total number of participants: 150 (30 male, 20 female, 70% minority)

Description:

Fairplay workshop was organized in cooperation with the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and FC Respekt, took place on 26 April 2024, at the Safet Zajko Center. The event brought together 50 participants, including 30 boys and 20 girls, aged 10 to 16, from diverse backgrounds. The workshop aimed to foster integration and support for minors from various reception centers through sports and educational activities. After the workshop, a tournament was organized for older migrants and refugees, providing them with an opportunity to showcase their skills and engage in friendly competition.



3. Workshop with refugees and migrants Hadžići I

Date: 24.05.2024

Location: Elementary School "March 6th," Hadžići

Workshop facilitators: Kristijan Veselinović, Hanna Bukvić, Selma Memović, Delila Bektešević, Adnan Piplaš

Total number of participants: 22 (16 male, 6 female)

Description:

The first fairplay workshop, organized in cooperation with International Organization for Migration (IOM) and FC Respekt took place on 24 May 2024, at the playground of the Elementary School "March 6th" in Hadžići. The event aimed to support and integrate minors from the Ušivak reception center through sports and educational workshops. Initially, the workshops were scheduled for two different age groups, but due to communication issues with the IOM team at the Ušivak reception center, the schedule had to be adjusted. After coordination with World Vision and IOM representatives, the workshops were restructured to accommodate older minors from 14:00 to 15:30.

The workshop began with a group discussion to familiarize participants with the methodology, considering language barriers. Participants used fairplay techniques to introduce themselves, followed by a warm-up session to prepare for the sports-educational stations. The process included an introduction and explanation, gameplay emphasizing inclusion and human rights, and a discussion and reflection session. Despite the cancellation of the children's workshop due to ongoing communication issues, the workshop successfully utilized various resources, including sports equipment and educational materials. The playground offered the necessary space for the activities, promoting mutual acquaintance and integration among participants. Overall, the event provided an inclusive environment, fostering new friendships and promoting fairplay values.



4. Workshop with refugees and migrants Hadžići II

Date: 25.05.2024

Location: Elementary School "March 6th," Hadžići

Workshop facilitators: Kristijan Veselinović, Hanna Bukvić, Selma Memović, Delila Bektešević, Adnan Piplaš

Total number of participants: 42 (31 male, 11 female)

Description:

Fairplay workshop was organized in cooperation with the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and FC Respekt, took place on 25 May 2024, at the Safet Zajko Center. The event brought together 50 participants, including 30 boys and 20 girls, aged 10 to 16, from diverse backgrounds. The workshop aimed to foster integration and support for minors from various reception centers through sports and educational activities. The workshop began with an icebreaker to help participants get to know each other and overcome language barriers. This was followed by a warm-up session, leading into various sports-educational stations that emphasized inclusion, fairplay, and human rights. The activities were designed to encourage teamwork, mutual understanding, and respect among participants. After the workshop, a tournament was organized for older migrants and refugees, providing them with an opportunity to showcase their skills and engage in friendly competition.



5. Workshop with NOVA ŽENA Team

Date: 02.07.2024

Location: Kulturno-sportski centar Vogošća

Workshop facilitators: Kristijan Veselinović

Total number of participants: 10 female

Description:

The Fairplay Workshop, held at the Kulturno-sportski centar Vogošća, was organized by Udruženje NOVA ŽENA on 02 July 2024. The event was led by Kristijan Veselinović, with 10 girls aged 11 to 13 participating. The workshop focused on fairplay, teamwork, and discrimination, using engaging activities such as balloon games, football field exercises, ice-breakers, memory games, and a yarn ball game. The session began with an ice-breaker game to introduce the participants to each other.

Despite not having prior knowledge about discrimination, the girls intuitively associated it with injustice, an issue they had encountered in school and life. Throughout the workshop, they quickly absorbed the knowledge and skills presented through the games, which they found both enjoyable and educational. The youngest members of the NOVA ŽENA team attended the workshop, with only one having participated in a similar event previously. The girls displayed a high level of cooperation, quickly grasping new concepts and skills. They thoroughly enjoyed the workshop, which was beneficial in fostering teamwork and understanding fair play principles.



6. Workshops on OPEN DAY at NK Stupčanica in Olovo

Date: 14.06.2024

Location: Danac Stadium, Olovo

Workshop facilitators: Zara Hrapović, Hanna Bukvić, Selma Memović, Delila Bektešević, Adnan Piplaš and NK Stupčanica staff

Total number of participants: 150 (100 male, 50 female)

Description:

This workshop, held at Danac Stadium in Olovo in collaboration with NK Stupčanica, brought together 150 youth participants for a day dedicated to fairplay, inclusivity, and teamwork. Led by NK Stupčanica staff and experienced Football Zajedno trainers, the event featured multiple educational and sports stations designed to instill values of respect and cooperation among young players. The facilitators guided the youth through activities such as football games, trust-building exercises, and group discussions, creating a comprehensive experience that reinforced fairplay principles. The workshop's design focused on engaging the participants through both active play and reflective sessions, allowing them to better understand the importance of inclusion and sportsmanship. In one of the most popular activities, participants practiced teamwork in competitive games that encouraged them to communicate effectively and support one another. The workshop succeeded in fostering an inclusive environment that highlighted the significance of unity and respect in sports. Feedback from participants reflected a deep appreciation for the opportunity to learn in such a collaborative and supportive setting, with many expressing excitement for future workshops.



(c) FAIRPLAY ACADEMY for Youth (16-20 years)

Date: 15. - 17.03.2024

Location: Budva, Montenegro

Total number of participants: 15 (9 female, 6 male)

Description:

The Football Zajedno Academy, held from 15th to 17th March 2024 at the Hotel Splendid in Budva, Montenegro, served as an advanced training program aimed at empowering facilitators who are actively involved in promoting intercultural dialogue, human rights, and social inclusion through football. The Academy featured a series of workshops and interactive sessions designed to deepen participants' understanding of nationalism, patriotism, and identity in the context of sports.

One of the primary workshops, "Flags and Fans - Pathways to Inclusive Patriotism," guided participants through activities that explored the dual faces of national pride in sports. Through a combination of storytelling, group discussions, and video presentations, participants reflected on how patriotism can unite or divide, depending on its expression. This workshop emphasized the importance of navigating these sentiments thoughtfully, fostering a shared understanding of inclusive patriotism that transcends boundaries and promotes unity.

Another key workshop focused on identity, where participants engaged in exercises to recognize and address the impact of ethnicity, gender, and religion on their experiences in sports. The interactive format encouraged open communication and collaboration, allowing participants to brainstorm solutions to common challenges faced in sports environments. This workshop underscored the role of education and dialogue in building more inclusive and respectful sports communities. The event was characterized by a dynamic and harmonious atmosphere, with participants showing high levels of engagement and interest. The interactive and participatory learning methods used throughout the academy not only enhanced the learning experience but also motivated participants to actively contribute their insights and solutions.

The Football Zajedno Academy successfully advanced the goals of promoting unity, diversity, and inclusion within sports. The outcomes of the workshops indicate significant progress toward creating a more inclusive environment in sports communities. Moving forward, the academy suggests providing more opportunities for participants to independently conduct workshops and deepen their understanding of complex issues such as nationalism in sports. This approach will further empower facilitators to drive positive change within their local communities. The Academy's structure allowed for deep reflection and skill-building, equipping participants with a stronger foundation to advocate for fairplay and social cohesion. By the end of the Academy, participants had acquired new tools and strategies, enhancing their ability to act as fairplay ambassadors. The intensive sessions not only provided advanced knowledge but also empowered these young leaders to approach social challenges with confidence and a sense of purpose, ready to apply fairplay principles within their own communities.

(a) INTERNATIONAL & REGIONAL Youth Tournaments

1. Tournament for Unaccompanied Minors and Refugees with Workshop with IOM and FC Respekt

Date: 26.04.2024

Location: Safet Zajko Sports Center

Partners: International Organization for Migration (IOM) and FC Respekt

Total number of participants: 50 (35 male, 15 female)

Description:

On April 26, 2024, a Fairplay workshop and tournament were organized at the Safet Zajko Sports Center in cooperation with the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and FC Respekt. The event aimed to foster integration and support for minors from different reception centers through sports and collaborative activities, bringing together participants from diverse backgrounds for a shared experience on the football field. The day began with an icebreaker to help participants, including minors and representatives from IOM, FC Respekt, and local teams, break down language barriers and get acquainted. Following a warm-up session, participants moved through sports-educational stations that focused on inclusion, fairplay, and human rights, emphasizing teamwork and mutual respect. The highlight of the event was the tournament itself, where mixed teams included unaccompanied minors, members from partner organizations, and local youth. This inclusive setup allowed participants to play side by side, fostering camaraderie and breaking down social divides.





2. Tournament for Unaccompanied Minors and Refugees with Workshop with IOM and FC Respekt

Date: 25.05.2024

Location: Ilidža Sports Hall

Partners: International Organization for Migration (IOM) and FC Respekt

Total number of participants: cca 100 (80 male, 20 female)

Description:

The tournament and workshop held at the Ilidža Sports Hall on May 25, 2024, followed a similar structure to the previous event at Safet Zajko Sports Center but brought together an even larger group of participants. With approximately 100 attendees, including both unaccompanied minors and local youth, the event aimed to foster social inclusion and community-building through sports. The day was divided into two sessions to maximize engagement: younger children and youth participated in the morning, while older minors and adults joined in the afternoon. The morning session began with a series of interactive icebreakers and warm-up exercises, allowing participants to ease into the day and connect with peers from different backgrounds. The younger participants then rotated through sports-educational stations that emphasized fairplay, teamwork, and respect for diversity, guided by facilitators from IOM, FC Respekt, and local partners. This inclusive environment enabled them to bond through shared activities and build connections across cultural divides. The afternoon brought the tournament's competitive spirit to life, with mixed teams that included older minors, adults, and representatives from the partner organizations. The setup allowed for an engaging and dynamic tournament, with players competing side by side, regardless of background. Each match showcased participants' skills and reinforced the values of fairplay and cooperation. The tournament concluded with friendly but intense matches, reflecting both the skills and bonds that had developed throughout the day.

Description:

Young players from the region got the possibility to take part in above mentioned tournaments. The tournament organisers and participating teams reflected the idea of social inclusion and reconciliation. The tournaments offered a unique opportunity for clubs, coaches and players to meet other teams and people. The aim of the tournaments was to promote inclusive grassroots sport activities and to bring together kids and youth from diverse backgrounds (ethnic minorities, girls, other vulnerable groups) and underprivileged regions.

(b) GIRLS FOOTBALL FESTIVAL – Intercultural Youth Exchange

Location: Vienna, Austria (Football Campus, Spielmannsgasse)

Description:

The Girls Football Festival (GFF) was successfully held in Vienna from 28th to 30th June 2024. The festival was organized as part of the Football Zajedno project, with significant support from the EU Sport Zajedno project. The event brought together young female football players from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Croatia, Montenegro, Serbia, and Austria, aiming to promote respect, diversity, and equality in sport while challenging nationalism and promoting international exchange.

This year marked a significant milestone for the Girls Football Festival as it was the first time mixed teams were introduced, a strategic initiative aimed at fostering greater coherence among participants and transcending the usual team spirit associated with players who arrived together. The idea behind this was to break down prejudices and barriers by encouraging players from different countries and backgrounds to work together, thereby promoting unity and mutual understanding. The results were overwhelmingly positive, as players eventually bonded, not just as teammates but as friends who learned to appreciate and celebrate their differences.

The external evaluation, conducted by an independent evaluator, confirmed the success of this approach, highlighting that the mixed teams significantly enhanced the overall experience by fostering inclusivity and breaking down stereotypes. Given the success of this format, we strongly recommend that mixed teams become a standard model for future Girls Football Festivals. This approach not only enriches the participants' experience but also aligns perfectly with the festival's mission of promoting respect, diversity, and equality through sport.

The festival began with the arrival of teams, who were warmly welcomed at the Football Campus in Vienna. Participants received festival packages, and the day featured an informal meet-and-greet at the Prater. This set a friendly and inclusive tone for the weekend, with players and coaches enjoying a shared meal and participating in fun games, followed by a finale at the Vienna Prater. The second day included a "Schnitzeljagd" (scavenger hunt) through Vienna, followed by lunch at WUK. This activity was particularly effective in fostering teamwork and cultural exchange. In the afternoon, mixed teams participated in football training sessions and workshop stations that focused on the values of fair play, diversity, and equality. The day concluded with a dinner and a lively Players Party, further strengthening the bonds between participants. The final day featured the much-anticipated Girls Football Festival Tournament. Mixed teams competed in a series of friendly but intense matches, showcasing not only their football skills but also the friendships and understanding they had developed over the weekend. The event concluded with a winners' ceremony, celebrating the participants' achievements and the festival's overall success.

The evaluation of the Girls Football Festival 2024 yielded highly positive feedback from participants, especially among the 30 young football players interviewed. Many of the youth expressed that the festival was a profoundly meaningful experience, allowing them to grow personally and learn alongside peers from diverse backgrounds. The fair play workshops, the competitive yet inclusive tournament, and opportunities to explore Vienna through social activities were particularly valued. While a few participants mentioned challenges, such as the lengthy travel, the short duration of the event, and minor logistical issues with accommodations and language barriers, these aspects did not significantly detract from their overall positive experience. Many players highlighted that this was the first time they had connected closely with individuals from different ethnic backgrounds, fostering unity and helping to break down long-standing prejudices. This intercultural exchange effectively promoted the values of respect, diversity, and equality, leaving a lasting impact on the young participants.

Feedback from the 48 professionals involved, including coaches and support staff, was also largely positive, with 56.25% of them providing input. The majority were satisfied with the festival's organization and content, appreciating the chance to network with other coaches, learn new methods, and actively participate in both the training sessions and tournament. Some professionals recommended improvements for future festivals, particularly regarding earlier travel arrangements, additional focus on social issues such as nationalism and discrimination, and enhanced logistical support on-site, including Wi-Fi access on the football field and more readily available charging points for equipment.

Overall, the Girls Football Festival 2024, co-financed by the EU Sport Zajedno project, successfully achieved its goals of promoting unity, diversity, and equality through sport, while also aligning with global efforts to advance gender equality and increase female inclusion in sports. Despite some logistical challenges, the festival set a solid foundation for future initiatives and offered a unique platform for skill development and intercultural connection among young female athletes. Moving forward, future editions of the festival would benefit from extending the event duration, refining logistical planning, and introducing more in-depth workshops on social issues, with additional emphasis on language support and inclusivity to further strengthen the festival's impact and accessibility.



(c) FOOTBALL ZAJEDNO CAMP – Regional Camps for Coaches, Kids and Youths

Football Zajedno Camp 2024

Date: 17. - 20.05.2024

Location: 44 (30 participants, 14 facilitators)

Partners: Football Associations of Bosnia and Herzegovina and Montenegro

Total number of participants: 44 (30 participants, 14 facilitators)

Description:

From May 17 to 20, 2024, the Football Zajedno Camp took place at the Sports and Recreation Center Ajdinovići. The camp was designed for young participants from Bosnia and Herzegovina and Montenegro, aged 15 to 20 + their coaches, who had previously engaged in other Football Zajedno activities, including the Mini Van Tour, Start-Up Pool, and the Girls's Football Festival. The camp combined sports, educational, and recreational activities, providing participants with an opportunity to learn about important social and sports-related topics such as human rights, discrimination, equality, fairplay, diversity, respect, and teamwork. The program was highly interactive, with activities structured around group work, discussions, and physical movement.

Trained facilitators who participated in the Football Zajedno Academy played an active role in the Camp by leading several workshops, applying their newly acquired skills in real-time with younger participants. This approach not only supported the sustainability of the program by empowering youth leaders to take on facilitation roles but also created a mentorship model that strengthens continuity within the initiative. By integrating trained facilitators into ongoing activities, Football Zajedno ensures that knowledge and fairplay principles are continuously shared and reinforced within the community. This design—where previous participants evolve into facilitators—is intentionally incorporated into all activities, fostering a cycle of learning, leadership, and community engagement that sustains and amplifies the impact of the project across different regions and groups.

Highlights of the camp included introductory sessions on fairplay methods, football matches, workshops on mental health, discussions on sustainability and eco-football, and practical sessions on using video as a medium for conveying messages. Participants also engaged in a treasure hunt, interactive discussions, and reflective sessions that emphasized the importance of fairplay and social inclusion.

The camp was facilitated by experienced educators and trainers from the Football Zajedno network. The environment at the Ajdinovići Center provided an ideal setting for participants to bond, learn, and grow together, fostering new friendships and reinforcing the values of fairplay and inclusivity. The camp concluded with a reflection and discussion session, followed by the awarding of certificates to all participants, recognizing their active involvement and commitment to the principles of the Football Zajedno project. As per feedback from the participants, the event was a great success.

The evaluation of the Football Zajedno Camp provided valuable insights into the participants' experiences. Participants particularly enjoyed the workshops on sports psychology, the variety of sports activities, and the opportunity to meet new people. The camp was described as a highlight of their lives, with many expressing appreciation for the diversity of activities and the chance to connect with others who share a passion for football. The evaluation highlighted areas for improvement, such as the need for more indoor workshops to avoid discomfort from high temperatures. Addressing these areas will further enhance the camp's effectiveness and provide an even more positive experience for future participants.

This camp was successfully integrated with the "Game Changers" project, jointly implemented by fairplay initiative, IZI, and another local organization- YIHR BiH in Bosnia and Herzegovina, amplifying the impact and reach of both initiatives. The activity within Game Changers project was Training of the Trainers (ToT) - component specifically designed to enhance the knowledge and practical skills of emerging facilitators within the Football Zajedno and Game Changers projects. By aligning programs from Football Zajedno and Game Changers, the camp offered a series of joint activities that fostered mutual learning and practical experience for the trainees. The collaboration between programs enriched the learning experience, reinforcing the commitment to developing capable, socially aware trainers who can extend fairplay values to wider communities.





(3) GOING PUBLIC (Awareness Raising & Capacity Building)

The application process was explained in the public call - after the submission deadline on December 4, 2023, all applications will be carefully reviewed. Candidates whose ideas meet the technical requirements and stand out for their originality will be contacted for further discussions. The selected projects will receive funding, which will be disbursed upon the successful completion of activities and the submission of a final report.

The activities began in January 1, 2024, and were completed by June 15, 2024. The Start Up Pool 2024 targeted various groups within the community, including children and youth (8-16 years), young people (16-21 years), and adults, particularly local sports educators, members of sports clubs, and NGOs. Special attention is given to projects that benefit vulnerable population groups.

Description:

The "GOal girls" Futsal Camp, held on February 11, 2024, at the Gymnasium Hall "Filip Višnjić" in Bijeljina, was a one-day event aimed at promoting futsal among young girls. Organized by Klub malog fudbala „Radnik“ Bijeljina, the camp brought together 41 participants, including 31 girls, to engage in various futsal-related activities.

The camp featured a workshop titled "The Advantages of Playing Futsal and Its Global Significance," led by experienced futsal players and trainers from KMF „Radnik“. The goal of the workshop was to educate the participants about the benefits of futsal and to inspire them to continue playing the sport. The girls learned about the complexity of futsal, its global relevance, and the increasing participation of women in the sport. Following the workshop, a training session was conducted, focusing on proper warm-up techniques essential for preventing injuries in this high-intensity sport. The training was designed according to FIFA Futsal coaching guidelines, ensuring that the activities were suitable for the girls' level of physical development and knowledge. The camp also included a skill development circuit aimed at enhancing the girls' endurance and motor skills. This was followed by a stretching session, after which certificates were awarded to all participants. The camp concluded with a social gathering, where participants exchanged experiences and provided valuable feedback for future camps.

The "GOal girls" Futsal Camp significantly contributed to the local community by encouraging a greater number of young girls to engage in futsal. The event was part of a broader effort to establish a women's futsal club in Bijeljina, inspired by the success of the men's team, KMF „Radnik“. Positive feedback from the participants and their enthusiasm for future events indicate that this initiative is on the right track. One of the highlights of the camp was the active participation and enthusiasm of the girls, who appreciated the opportunity to engage in an event tailored specifically for them. The organizers received positive feedback, with many girls expressing their excitement for future camps. The event also served as a platform for fostering new friendships and encouraging regular participation in futsal.

The Start Up Pool project implemented by ŽRK „Bosna“ Tešanj focused on empowering young girls through sports, particularly handball. The project took place over a period of three months, beginning on March 27, 2024, and included a series of innovative and dynamic training sessions that combined elements of both handball and football.

The training sessions were designed to be more engaging by integrating football skills into handball practices, thus creating a more diverse and challenging training environment. The sessions emphasized physical fitness, teamwork, and mental strength, with additional support provided by a sports psychologist to help participants develop their mental resilience.

Each training session was carefully planned to ensure that participants not only improved their handball skills but also benefited from the inclusion of football drills, which enhanced their overall coordination and motor skills. The project was documented and shared on social media, keeping the community informed about the innovative activities being conducted by the club.

Through this project, ŽRK „Bosna“ Tešanj successfully motivated young people in the local community to engage in sports and overcome existing prejudices. By merging two sports, handball and football, the project offered innovative and exciting activities that contributed to team building and the overall development of both younger and older athletes. This approach expanded the horizons of young people in the community, encouraging them to pursue the sports they truly love and try new ones when given the opportunity.

The project introduced a new dynamic to the local sports scene, attracting positive attention and support from the community, which further encouraged participation and interest in sports among young people.

One of the most significant achievements of the project was the increase in club membership, as several new members expressed a desire to join ŽRK „Bosna“ Tešanj. Additionally, the project provided young people with positive opportunities that were previously unavailable in the local area. By presenting the importance of sports in a fun, interactive, and beneficial way, the project contributed to the development of sports culture in Tešanj, encouraging young people to stay active and engaged in their community.

The project included both a football workshop and a public event in the town's Main Street, transforming the area into a lively football field.

Activities and Themes

Day 1 (May 18, 2024): A football workshop was held at the City Stadium for students of the lower grades of the elementary school and older children from the “Neven” Kindergarten in Višegrad. Licensed UEFA B coaches, Goran Bogdanović and Dragan Vulević, led the workshop, which focused on teaching the basics of football, including ball control, passing, and receiving. The workshop lasted two hours and attracted around 50 boys and one girl, with the youngest participant being just 3 years old.

Day 2 (May 19, 2024): The event titled “Dan fudbala” (Football Day) was organized on Main Street in Višegrad, where the street was closed off and turned into a large football field. The event was open to all, and it successfully drew a large crowd, including children, parents, and passersby. The day was filled with football games, laughter, and the joy of playing together, highlighting the unifying power of sports.

This project contributed to the local community by promoting football as a popular and beneficial sport for children and youth. It successfully engaged several children who had not previously participated in sports, encouraging them to adopt healthy habits. Additionally, the transformation of Main Street into a football field brought a sense of community and joy to the town, as children and adults alike participated in the event. The project also fostered social cohesion by involving participants from different backgrounds and age groups.

The greatest success of the project was the ability to engage a large number of young participants in football, many of whom had not been involved in sports before. The event on Main Street was particularly impactful, as it turned a typical day in the town into a festive and vibrant celebration of football. The participation of local officials, including the mayor of Višegrad, Mladen Đurević, further underscored the importance of the event, and plans were made to make “Dan fudbala” an annual tradition in Višegrad.

The best part of the project was the ability to bring smiles and happiness to the children as they played football together. The project successfully encouraged children to leave their homes, away from computers and phones, and engage in physical activity that brought them joy and a sense of accomplishment.

Description:

The Start Up Pool project implemented by FK Stakorina Čajniče was held on May 22, 2024, at Stadion Rakovice in Čajniče. The event aimed to promote sports and foster friendships among children from Čajniče and the neighboring town of Goražde through a series of fun and competitive activities.

Activities and Themes

Skill Circuits: The event began with a series of skill circuits where the children showcased their agility and competitive spirit. These circuits included activities like foot tennis and football in small spaces (1 vs. 1 and 4 vs. 4), which were particularly popular among the participants.

Football Matches: Following the skill circuits, the children participated in football matches that allowed them to apply the techniques they had practiced.

Refreshment Breaks: Between activities, the children enjoyed refreshments, including sweets, juices, and fruits, giving them a chance to rest and socialize with their peers.

Cultural Tour: After the sports activities, the participants and organizers toured the local religious sites and the town of Čajniče, giving the guests from Goražde an opportunity to explore the town and appreciate its natural beauty.

This project contributed to the local community by promoting the tourist potential of Čajniče and encouraging the inclusion of children in sports. The event highlighted the town's capacity to host similar activities in the future, strengthening the bonds between local children and those from neighboring communities. Additionally, the event promoted the town and the football club, fostering new sports friendships and encouraging ongoing participation in sports.

The greatest success of the project was witnessing how the children from Goražde connected with the local children as if they had known each other for years. The event successfully fostered new friendships through sports, laying the foundation for continued collaboration and joint activities in the future.

The best part of the project was seeing the joy on the children's faces as they participated in various activities. The event not only brought them together through sports but also allowed them to form lasting friendships, proving that love for sports can unite different groups of children in small towns.

Description:

The Start Up Pool project organized by SPORTUM focused on the intrinsic motivation and mental health of female athletes, particularly those involved in competitive sports. The event took place on May 20, 2024, at the Sports Hall Zetra in Sarajevo and included a workshop followed by individual sessions with a sports psychologist.

Activities and Themes

Initial Meeting: The event began with an individual meeting with one of the trainers, during which the current challenges faced by the club were discussed. The meeting provided support to the trainer and addressed personal challenges related to coaching.

Workshop: The main workshop was designed for the gymnasts and focused on understanding what motivates them in sports, what demotivates them, how they experience burnout, and how these factors impact their mental health. The workshop was interactive, with each gymnast sharing her experiences and participating in various tasks, including a puzzle activity that taught psychological techniques to help manage burnout.

Conclusion and Individual Sessions:

The workshop concluded with each gymnast having the opportunity to share what they learned and how they plan to apply it in their daily lives. Those who needed further assistance had the chance to speak individually with the sports psychologist about their personal challenges.

This project made a contribution to the local community by providing free access to a sports psychologist for young athletes. In a region where psychological services can be expensive and stigmatized, this project helped break down barriers and provided the girls with valuable tools to manage their mental health. The project also invested in the trainers, ensuring that they can pass on their knowledge to future generations of athletes.

The greatest success of the project was breaking the stigma around working with a psychologist, especially in a region where such work is often viewed negatively. By encouraging the gymnasts to seek help when needed, the project provided them with the resources to address mental health challenges early on, preventing more significant issues later. Additionally, the project addressed a specific need within the sports team, tailoring the workshop to the current challenges faced by the athletes.

The most rewarding part of the project was receiving positive feedback from the gymnasts and trainers, who were excited to apply what they had learned. The trainers were particularly grateful for the timing of the project, as they had noticed that many gymnasts were struggling with burnout and loss of motivation. The workshop provided a safe space for the girls to discuss serious issues and offered them tools to cope with these challenges.

Participant Testimonials:

- *"The workshop was excellent. I'm very motivated to set new goals that will help me enjoy training more."*

- *"I had never worked with a psychologist before. I thought psychologists only worked with people who have mental problems. The workshop was great, and I learned that I can always work on myself to be a better version of myself."*

- *"It was an interesting workshop. I liked the puzzle task the most. Now, whenever I feel unmotivated during training, I'll remember this example."*

The Start Up Pool project organized by JU Gimnazija Prnjavor and JU Muzička škola „Konstantin Babić” Prnjavor, through its female football section, was held on May 10, 2024, in celebration of the International Day of Physical Activity. The project aimed to promote women's football and enhance the quality of life for young people through sports, socialization, and physical activity.

Activities and Themes

Formation of the Female Football Section: The school section for female football began at the start of the 2023/2024 school year, marking the first time such a section had been established in these schools due to high student interest.

Regular Training Sessions: The section held regular training every Friday from 12:15 PM to 1:45 PM. The section also participated in the Regional Competition in Ribnik on February 13, 2024, where they won third place, marking the first medal in the history of the schools.

Promotion of Football: From April 1-5, 2024, the section promoted football in the sixth grades of JU OŠ „Branko Ćopić” in Prnjavor, sparking great enthusiasm and interest among the students.

Final Friendly Match: On May 10, 2024, the project culminated in a final friendly match between the school section and ŽFK „Ljubić” from Prnjavor, held during the International Day of Physical Activity. Other sports clubs also participated, showcasing their sports in practical demonstrations.

Participation in the Game Changers Camp: From May 17-20, 2024, the section participated in the Football Zajedno Camp at the Sports and Recreation Center Ajdinovići near Olovo, part of the Game Changers project. The section also presented their project at the Faculty of Philosophy, University of Banja Luka, on June 12, 2024.

This project contributed to the local community by promoting sports, particularly women's football, and encouraging the socialization and physical activity of students. The project emphasized the importance of a safe and healthy environment for youth, helping to prevent and counteract the increasing issue of peer violence.

The greatest success of the project was maintaining a motivated and cohesive team throughout the school year. Despite challenges, no student left the team, and all supported each other, even playing matches while injured or unwell. The project's activities, ambitions, and accomplishments marked the 2023/2024 school year as unique and successful.

The best part of the project was the opportunities it provided for education, socialization, and travel, along with the new equipment acquired through the project. The project also successfully promoted women's football, which had never been offered as a school section before, bringing significant attention and support from the community.

Description:

The Start Up Pool project organized by FK „Naprijed“ 1951 Banja Luka took place on June 6, 2024, at the FK „Naprijed“ Stadium and Obilićevo Football Field. The event, titled “Dani otvorenih vrata” (Open Days), was designed to introduce young children to the basics of football, promote inclusivity and gender equality, and encourage physical activity among the youngest members of the community.

Activities and Themes

Introduction to Football Basics: Children were introduced to the fundamental elements of football, including the football field layout, basic rules of the game, and essential ball control skills. The activities were structured to be simple and understandable for young participants.

Skill Development: The event included exercises focused on ball control, balance, and coordination. Activities like “Snake” (dribbling through cones) and balance challenges were used to develop motor skills in a fun and engaging way.

Inclusive Games and Teamwork: Exercises such as short, precise passing in pairs and group activities like “Circle and Pass” were used to teach the values of teamwork and inclusivity.

Mini Matches and Fair Play: The children participated in small-sided games (3 vs. 3 or 4 vs. 4) without goalkeepers, allowing them to apply their skills in a match setting while learning about fair play and respect for teammates and opponents.

Thematic Games: The event featured themed games such as “Treasure Hunt,” “Skill Obstacle Course,” “Goalkeeper Challenge,” and “Balloon Football,” which combined physical exercise with playful elements to keep the children engaged.

The project made a contribution to the local community by promoting healthy lifestyles and physical activity among young children. The event provided a platform for children to learn about football in a supportive and inclusive environment, fostering a love for the sport and encouraging social interaction. The involvement of local kindergartens and elementary schools helped strengthen community ties and provided an opportunity for parents and children to connect through sports.

The most significant success of the project was the visible progress and enjoyment of the children. Many of the participants, who had little or no previous experience with football, showed remarkable improvement in their skills and confidence. Conclusion for Start Up Pool 2024 Initiatives:

The Start Up Pool 2024 initiatives successfully spanned various geographical locations across Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Montenegro bringing together diverse communities through a shared commitment to sports, education, and social inclusion. The projects, which involved a broad spectrum of activities—from football training and environmental education to mental health workshops and community engagement—were strategically implemented in both urban and rural settings, reflecting the unique needs and challenges of each locality.

Across the different locations, a total of over 1,200 participants were engaged, ranging from young children as young as three years old to older youth and adults. These participants benefited from a variety of tailored programs that not only focused on developing sports skills but also emphasized the importance of social cohesion, inclusivity, mental health, and environmental awareness.

One of the most significant achievements of these initiatives was their success in overcoming ethnic divisions, which have historically challenged social cohesion in the region. By bringing together participants from various ethnic backgrounds to share in the joy of sports and collaborative activities, the Start Up Pool 2024 contributed breaking down barriers, fostering mutual respect, and building friendships across ethnic lines.

These efforts were particularly evident in mixed-community events where children and youth who might otherwise have limited interaction were able to connect through their shared love of football and teamwork, creating lasting bonds that transcend ethnic identities.

The geographical diversity of the initiatives, covering areas such as Banja Luka, Prnjavor, Sarajevo, Višegrad, Čajniče, and Rožaje, underscored the universal appeal and necessity of sports as a tool for community development and personal growth. In urban centers like Sarajevo and Banja Luka, the focus was on large-scale events that brought together hundreds of children to engage in organized sports and physical activities, promoting healthy lifestyles and community bonding. In contrast, rural areas such as Čajniče and Rožaje saw projects that not only introduced sports to young people but also integrated environmental education and cultural exploration, addressing local needs for both physical activity and environmental awareness.

The diverse topics covered—ranging from gender equality in sports, mental health, and fair play to environmental conservation and physical fitness—highlighted the holistic approach taken by these initiatives. Each project was designed to address specific local challenges, whether it was promoting gender inclusivity in traditionally male-dominated sports, providing psychological support to young athletes, or encouraging environmental responsibility through football.

In conclusion, the Start Up Pool 2024 initiatives collectively contributed to strengthening community ties, fostering a culture of inclusivity, and promoting the physical and mental well-being of participants across a wide geographical area. The success of these projects, as evidenced by the high levels of engagement and positive feedback from participants and local communities, demonstrates the powerful impact of sports-based initiatives in driving social change and improving the quality of life across the region.




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

Social Media Insight Analysis

The public awareness campaigns, particularly the targeted social media content, have significantly enhanced the visibility of both the Football Zajedno project. On Facebook, the campaign reached a total of 15.2K individuals, with 2.9K visitors to the page and a net increase of 76 followers. On Instagram, the project achieved a reach of 14.8K, attracting 2.2K visitors and gaining 208 new followers. Combining these efforts, the total reach across both platforms amounted to 30K individuals. These results reflect the effectiveness of the engagement strategies, the strong positive reception of the content, and the successful creation of a sense of community, bringing together diverse groups with shared values.

Also, as reported in the last interim report, social media content related to the Girls Football Festival 2023 generated 30,000 interactions on Instagram, with over 200 stories reaching more than 10,000 accounts. During the festival week, the Fairplay channels saw an increase of 80 new followers. Projections for 2024 suggest an even greater outreach, with expectations for around 35,000 interactions. Notably, one of the festival videos reached approximately 7,500 accounts, becoming one of the top-performing posts of 2024.





Social Media Analysis

The recent social media activity has shown engagement and growth across both Facebook and Instagram platforms. Below is an analysis of the key metrics:

Facebook:

Reach: The project's posts on Facebook reached 15.2K individuals. This wide reach indicates that the content resonated well with the audience, successfully capturing the attention of a diverse group of users.

Visitors: Facebook recorded 2.9K visitors, reflecting strong interest and engagement. This metric suggests that a significant portion of the audience who saw the content was motivated to learn more by visiting the Facebook page.

New Followers: The page gained 76 new followers during this period.

Instagram:

Reach: On Instagram, the project achieved a reach of 14.8K. This reach is slightly lower than Facebook but still indicates a substantial audience engagement, especially considering Instagram's typically more visual and interactive nature.

Visitors: Instagram attracted 2.2K visitors, showing that a considerable number of users took the step to visit the profile after engaging with the content in their feed. This is a positive indicator of user interest and the platform's effectiveness in driving traffic.

New Followers: Instagram saw a significant increase in followers, with 208 new users joining the community. This growth rate is notably higher than Facebook, suggesting that Instagram may be particularly effective in engaging users and converting them into followers.
